Roberto Bissio (ITeM's director) and **Martin Khor** (Third World Network director and member of the project's Board) will discuss the papers, frame WSIS in the global governance processes that are shaping today's information society and provide an insight into the role that Civil Society and Southern governments have in these processes.

The presentations will be followed by questions and input from attendees.
